

The best way to experience the unique landscape of the Romantic Rhine is on a walking or cycle tour. You are spoiled for choice between the long-distance Rheinsteig trail and the RheinBurgenWeg, over 30 of the finest circular hikes, and the Rheinradweg. 1 Rheinsteig Trail

The Rheinsteig Trail runs from Wiesbaden to Bonn, a distance of around 320 km. Divided into different stages, the Rheinsteig lends itself to both shorter day walks and long-distance hiking. Following an earthquake. the only thing left of Rolandseck castle was the window arch. which became an emblem of Rhine romanticism. 'Rolandsbogen' archway, with its view over the Rhine valley and the Seven Mountains Range (Siebengebirge), became a tourist attraction in the 19th century.
